Confirmation:

By now parents/guardians should have received 2017 Confirmation Orientation letter. If you have not received this letter, please contact Dan Miller at the parish center as soon as possible.

Confirmation Class 2017 Orientation: This orientation will be held on August 21st and August 28th, both sessions beginning at 7pm in the CCGB Parish Center. *At least one parent/guardians as well as the candidate must attend one of the two sessions.*

Young people eligible for Confirmation...

- Are entering the 9th grade or higher
- Successfully completed a year of religious education, or Catholic school, prior to the Fall of 2016.
- Are Baptized and have received the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist.

1st Reconciliation:

Parents should be receiving registration information for 2016 Reconciliation. To be eligible for Reconciliation, young people must meet the following guidelines:

- In the 2nd grade, or higher.
- Currently enrolled in Religious Education classes, or private Catholic school.
- Must have successfully completed a whole year of religious education (or Catholic private school) prior to the fall of 2016.

Please Remember: Young people wishing to receive the 1st Communion in the Spring of 2017 must complete sacramental preparation in the fall of 2016.

Parent Session: All parents of young people receiving the sacrament are to attend a parent information session on September 21st, or September 28th. Both meetings will be held at CCGB Parish Center and will begin at 6:30pm. Only one parent/guardian need to attend one of the two meetings.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

Due to Health Department regulations, each child must have his/her own **headphones to use in the Computer Lab**. Your child's headphones will be labeled with his/her name and kept in a plastic, ziploc bag in the Computer Lab. The headphones are used throughout the student's years at Monsignor Slade. Also, due to Health Department regulations, each child must have his/her own **safety goggles to use in the Science Lab**. Safety goggles will be labeled with the student's name and kept in a plastic, ziploc bag in the Science Lab. Goggles are supplied in the 6th grade and are used throughout the student's middle school years at Slade.

* Packet item will be distributed by the teacher

** **Included in the cost of the packet for grades 4-8, there is a novel fee for required reading. The cost of these novel fees are as follows:** Grade 4 - \$8.00, Grade 5 - \$8.00, Grade 6 - \$13.00, Grade 7 - \$15.00, Grade 8 - \$18.00. This money is collected at the time your packet is purchased; however, the novels will be distributed by your student's teacher.

Included in the required packet for grades 7 & 8 is a \$7.00 **Science Lab fee** used to offset supplies used in the Science Lab.

Explanation of the Service Hours Program for 2016-2017

Each family with students enrolled in grades Pre-K4 (Full Day)-8 will be responsible for completing its own hours. Participants must be 21 years of age or older. Any high school age child that assists for any school function will only be able to receive credit towards their high school community service hours. Service hours cannot be shared among families or friends.

Please note: It is *your* responsibility to sign in and out so that you receive proper credit for hours worked.

Only activities listed below, or approved by the Support Programs Coordinator in writing, will qualify for Service Hours Program credit. Excess hours cannot be carried over to the following school year.

Advancement Committee - Volunteers are needed with experience in areas such as marketing, advertising, publishing, communications and/or grant-writing, to assist the Development and Admissions Offices in promoting and increasing the visibility of Monsignor Slade Catholic School. Requires attendance at monthly meetings (held during the school day) and participation in sub-committees addressing areas mentioned above that will also involve some after-school and/or weekend volunteer time.

Baking for Events - If you choose to bake for events, you will be notified of the upcoming events and the type of baked goods needed. You must send in one cake, two dozen cupcakes or two dozen brownies, etc., to receive one hour of credit for each event. No credit will be given for store-bought items. A list of the baking events include: Christmas at Slade, two Grandparents' Days, Family Bingo, and monthly bake sales for students. You will be notified of any additional baking opportunities. (No other areas that you may be asked to donate baked goods for during the school year will earn any Service Hours Program credit, i.e., sporting banquet, band banquet, etc.) A letter will be sent home at the end of September explaining the specifics for this event to those who sign up to bake for events.

Classroom Aide - You may work any day, Monday through Friday, in the kindergarten through 8th grade, as needed by a teacher. Please contact your child's homeroom teacher for further information as to dates, times, etc. Aides assist the teacher by working with individual students or small groups of students. Hours will be credited for services performed between 8:15 and 2:00 p.m. Room parent hours will also be credited under this program. In order to receive proper credit for your service hours, you must indicate "Classroom Aide" and the homeroom number for which you are assisting when you sign in at the Front Office. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Club Volunteer - Parents volunteer to assist the club moderator in various capacities as requested by the teacher. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Hospitality Committee - This committee will be responsible for set-up, including making coffee and punch, serving and clean up. This work would be done at the August 24, 2016 - New Parents' Night; October 5 and 6, 2016—Muffins with Mom; November 11, 2016 and January 29, 2017- Open House; February 15 and 16, 2017- Donuts with Dad; April 5 and 6, 2017 - Grandparents' Days. You will be scheduled by the Hospitality Chairperson to work for these receptions and/or socials. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Maintenance - Assist our maintenance engineer with the grounds work, painting, hauling, and more. Weekday and weekend opportunities are available. If interested, you are responsible to contact our Facilities Manager at (410) 766-1598 and leave a message. Be sure to include your daytime phone number.

Office Volunteer - The school office needs volunteers who can do occasional clerical work. Typical in-school jobs would include front desk reception, preparing mailing materials, making copies for teachers, etc. At-home volunteer work would include: making phone calls, stuffing envelopes, applying labels and postage to mailings, clipping soup labels and box tops, etc. Please contact the administrative assistant with any specific questions.

Parent Cleaning Days - November 5, 2016, January 28, 2017 and April 30, 2017.

Whenever parent cleaning days are scheduled, parents come to school to do some general cleaning and yard work. This event takes place from approximately 7:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturdays, and from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. You will receive one hour of credit for every hour worked.

Sports Programs - Sports hours are earned as follows: Offices: Athletic Council Officers - 16 hours; Sports Commissioners - 16 hours; Sport Directors - 16 hours; Teams: Coach - 16 hours; Assistant Coach (up to two per team) - 10 hours; Team Parent - 5 hours. Any questions may be directed to one of the Athletic Council members listed in the Handbook or on the Slade sports website—www.sladesports.com. All participants that are planning to volunteer in the sports program must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Technology Committee - Volunteers are needed with experience in Information Technology to assist the Committee in improving the school's utilization of technology to enhance communication and teaching and learning opportunities for the students, faculty, and staff. Those considered for membership on this committee will assess the current state of school technology and make recommendations for future acquisitions, as well as assist in the evaluation and revision of the school's technology plan. Meetings will be held in the evening at school.

Uniform Exchange - Volunteers are needed to help sort and organize donated uniforms prior to the scheduled uniform exchange sale. During the event, volunteers help shoppers locate desired uniform items. The Uniform Exchange is held three times per year with volunteers expected to work from 2:00-6:30 p.m. All volunteers must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Home and School Association Activities

For the following Home and School Association activities, the Service Hours Program will credit your account as follows: For every hour worked, you will receive one hour of credit, with the exception of those people who are appointed chairperson. The chairperson will receive their full 16 hours of credit for chairing these activities.

Sports Cards: Help is needed to set up tables and chairs early in the morning, give general assistance during the day, and clean-up after the event. *Please note*: Hours for May show will be applied to the 2017-2018 school year.

Yankee Candle Sale: This event involves tallying, packing and distributing orders in school during the day. All in-school participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Christmas at Slade: This event requires organizing or working on the various committees, set-up, working the December event, and clean-up. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Family Bingo: This event requires people to assist as kitchen crew and/or floor workers during family bingo. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Roadrunner Race for Slade: This event takes place during the school day. Parents are needed to man checkpoint stations throughout the race. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Spring Bull Roast: This one-day event requires volunteers to help plan, organize, and work together on various committees throughout the school year. Volunteers are needed to help set up, work, and clean up on the day of the event.

Color Run: This event takes place on Saturday morning. Parents are needed to monitor at checkpoint stations throughout the race. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Flower Mart: This event requires people to assist with setting-up and selling of the plants to the children and parents during school hours. All participants must be Shield the Vulnerable/STAND compliant.

Dear Parents,

Again this year, Monsignor Slade Catholic School will be offering the "Service Hours Program". It is a great way to become involved in your child's education. Each family is required to give sixteen hours of service during the school year or pay an additional \$400.00 tuition by November 1, 2016. Please consult the MSCS Parent & Student Handbook for the payment schedule if choosing to pay rather than perform service hours. Please remember that STV/STAND training is necessary for many areas of volunteering.

The students here at Slade profit greatly from your services. Classrooms benefit from parent aides, the sport programs are able to remain strong, and the school community realizes a greater participation in the fundraising activities, to name a few.

This sign-up sheet needs to be returned to the school by September 9, 2016. Events coded A take place in the first half of the school year, and the events coded B take place in the second half of the school year. All other activities are events which take place throughout the year. Be sure to note events that occur in the beginning of the school year on your calendar. We cannot guarantee that you will be able to work in your chosen area, but we will do our best to accommodate your requests. The earlier you return this sheet, the better your chances of getting the area you have requested. Workers will be chosen on a first-come, first-served basis. Please refer to the explanation sheet when selecting your area of interest because not all choices will complete your hours by themselves. If you have not been contacted within two weeks of an event, it is your responsibility to contact the proper chairperson listed in the Parent & Student Handbook. If your family does not return the Service Hours Program form, we will assume that you agree to pay the \$400.00 fee by November 1, 2016. After all forms have been returned, a list will be compiled for each individual event. You will receive a confirmation notice by late September indicating which events you signed up to work.

We encourage parents to contribute their service, and require that they complete their time by May 1, 2017. The only exceptions to this deadline are the Flower Mart dates, which are scheduled in early May. Any hours not completed by this date will be billed at the maximum rate of \$31.25 per hour for the delinquent hours. When parents participate in Service Hours activities, they are responsible to sign in and out. If a sign-in sheet cannot be located, be sure to ask the chairperson! Parents must take the initiative to complete their hours by the May 1 deadline.

Those parents who choose to send in the \$400.00 are asked to do so by November 1, 2016. Please indicate on the check that this is your Service Hours Program payment. Any payment not received by the November 1 deadline will increase according to the payment schedule in the Parent & Student Handbook.

Monsignor Slade Catholic School is excited to announce a new Family Referral Program, “Spirit of Slade,” that will begin with our 2016-2017 school year. Please consider sharing the opportunity to be enriched by the “Spirit of Slade” and this community with other families. Our parents and current students are our greatest ambassadors; we count on you to help our school grow and succeed. This program will reward both currently enrolled full-time Pre-K4 - 7th grade families who have referred new families to Monsignor Slade Catholic School and the new family who enrolls.

Current Families

- ◆ Open to all MSCS families with currently enrolled Pre-K4 (full-time) through 7th grade students
- ◆ For every new family that lists your family's name in the “Referred by” field on their enrollment applicant form and completes one full year of school with us, your family will receive a \$250 tuition credit for the following school year.
- ◆ Tuition credits are awarded on a per **FAMILY**, not per student, basis.
- ◆ You may refer more than one new family and receive additional credit. The amount of referral tuition credits cannot exceed the total Catholic rate tuition for any given year. Tuition credits cannot be redeemed for cash.

For example:

- ⇒ You recommend Family A for next year. Family A registers, lists your family in the “Referred by” field on the application form, and successfully completes the 2016-2017 school year at Slade. Your family will then receive \$250 credit toward the 2017-2018 school year in FACTS.
- ⇒ Your family was also listed on Family B’s application and they successfully completed the 2016-17 school year. Your family will receive another \$250 credit toward the 2017-18 school year.
- ⇒ This can be repeated additional times for the same school year until the credit to your account equals one full 2017-18 tuition rate (registered Catholic amount). *For referring family only.

Prospective New Families

- ◆ A new family is defined as a family NOT currently enrolled in either the Pre-K program or the Pre-K4- 8th grade at MSCS.
- ◆ Prospective families receive a \$250 tuition credit by listing the fully enrolled Pre-K4 (full-time) - 7th grade Referring Family’s name on their initial enrollment application. Tuition credits are awarded on a per **FAMILY**, not per student, basis. Tuition credits **are not** transferrable.
- ◆ Only one family may be listed as a Referring Family. There are no exceptions to this.
- ◆ New family must be registered by October 31, 2016, and complete the entire 2016-17 school year and be current on all accounts in order to earn \$250 credit toward 2017-18 tuition.

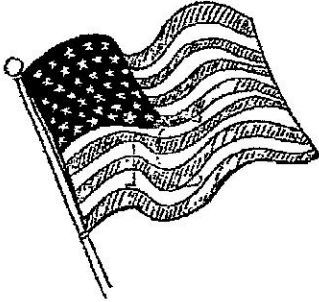

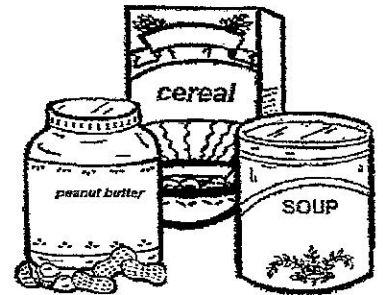
